

GENERAL WARRANTY DEED

WITH RELINQUISHMENT OF DOWER.

THIS INDENTURE, Made and entered into this day of October, one thousand nine hundred and sixby and between David Burner, a single man,
Rentie Ind. Inv. part of the first part; and James C. Webber, trustee of company,
Muskogee Ind. Inv. part of the second part;WITNESSETH, That the said party of the first part, for and in consideration of the sum of Fifty dollars (\$50.00) and other
considerations, DOLLARS, in hand paid, the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged,
does hereby grant, bargain, sell, convey and confirm unto the said party of the second part the following described real estate and premises situated in the
Muskogee (Creek) Nation, and within the limits of the Indian Territory, to wit:East half of south west quarter, and the south west quarter of south west quarter, of section Nine (9) of Township
Eighteen (18), North Range Thirteen (13) East, Containing One hundred & Twenty acres more or less.

together with all the improvements thereon, and the appurtenances and immunities thereunto belonging or in any wise appertaining thereto

To have and to hold the aforesigned premises to the said James C. Webber, trustee,
and his heirs and successors, in fee simple forever; and the said David Burner
and his heirs, executors and administrators do covenant with the said James C. Webber, trustee
and his heirs, successors and assigns, that he has lawfully seized in fee of the aforesigned premises; that
they are free from all incumbrances; that he has full good right to sell and convey the same to said James C. Webber,
trustee; and that he will and his successors, heirs, executors and administrators shall warrant and defend the same to the said James C. Webber, trustee
and his heirs, successors and assigns forever against the lawful claims and demands of all persons.And I, Willie Thorpe, Rentie S.T. wife of said David Burner, do hereby release and relinquish unto the said party of the second part all my right of dower and homestead in and to the said lands.
