

# GENERAL WARRANTY DEED

DEPARTMENT OF JUSTICE

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**THIS INDENTURE**, Made and entered into this 20th day of February, 1902, one thousand nine hundred and two, by and between James A. Long and Nora R. Long his wife, of Muskogee, Indian Territory, parties of the first part, and William S. Turnman of Okmulgee, I. T., party of the second part;

WITNESSETH, That that the said party of the first part, for and in consideration of the sum of Eight Hundred, (\$800.00) DOLLARS, in hand paid, the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged, do hereby grant, bargain, sell, convey and confirm unto the said party of the second part the following described real estate and premises situated in the Muskogee or Creek Nation, and within the limits of the Indian Territory, to wit:

The Northeast, <sup>or Quarter</sup> One fourth ( $\frac{1}{4}$ ) of the Northeast, <sup>Quarter</sup> ( $\frac{1}{4}$ ), of Section Six, (6), Township Nineteen, (19), North Range Thirteen, (13), East in the Creek Nation, Indian Territory, containing Forty (40) acres and being a part of the allotment of Boone P. Riley deceased,

together with all the improvements thereon, and the appurtenances and immunities thereto belonging or in anywise appertaining thereto.

To have and to hold the aforesigned premises to the said William S. Turnman and his heirs and assigns in fee simple forever; and we the said James A. Long and Nora R. Long for ourselves and our heirs, executors and administrators do covenant with the said William S. Turnman and his heirs, successors and assigns, that we lawfully seized in fee of the aforesigned premises; that they are free from all incumbrances, that we have good right to sell and convey the same <sup>unto the</sup> to said William S. Turnman aforesaid; and that we will and our successors, heirs, executors and administrators shall warrant and defend the same <sup>unto</sup> to the said William S. Turnman and his heirs, successors and assigns forever against the lawful claims and demands of all persons.

And I, Nora R. Long, wife of said James A. Long <sup>but before and after the execution hereof and the giving and delivery of this instrument,</sup> for and in consideration of the said sum of money, do hereby release and relinquish unto the said party of the second part all my rights of dower and homestead in and to the said lands.
