

GENERAL WARRANTY DEED

WITH RELINQUISHMENT OF DOWER.

THIS INDENTURE, Made and entered into this 18th day of March, one thousand nine hundred and seven, by and between William A. Turnman and Beerie P. Turnman, her husband, of Omulgee, Okl., part one of the first part, and O. M. Lancaster and L. M. Drawn of Tulsa, Okl., part two of the second part;

WITNESSETH, That that the said part one of the first part, for and in consideration of the sum of Three Thousand Four Hundred DOLLARS, in hand paid, the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged, do hereby grant, bargain, sell, convey and confirm unto the said part two of the second part the following described real estate and premises situated in the Muskogee or Creek Nation, and within the limits of the Indian Territory, to-wit:

The West One-half (1/2) of the South East Quarter (S.E. 1/4) of Section Thirty-one (31) in Township Nineteen (19) North, Range Fourteen (14) East, containing Eighty (80) acres of land, more or less.

together with all the improvements thereon, and the appurtenances and immunities thereon belonging or in any wise appertaining thereto.

To have and to hold the aforesigned premises to the said O. M. Lancaster and L. M. Drawn and their heirs and successors, in fee simple forever; and we the said William A. Turnman and Beerie P. Turnman, for ourselves and our heirs, executors and administrators do covenant with the said O. M. Lancaster and L. M. Drawn and their heirs, successors and assigns, that we are lawfully seized in fee of the aforesigned premises; that they are free from all incumbrance, as aforesaid; and that we will and will successors, heirs, executors and administrators shall warrant and defend the same to the said O. M. Lancaster and L. M. Drawn and their heirs, successors and assigns forever against the lawful claims and demands of all persons.

And I, Beriee P. Turnman of Omulgee, Okl., wife of said William A. Turnman, for and in consideration of the said sum of money, do hereby release and relinquish unto the said part two of the second part all my right of dower and homestead in and to the said lands.
