

GENERAL WARRANTY DEED

WITH ABANDONMENT OF DOWER

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THIS INDENTURE, made and entered into this 25 day of October, one thousand nine hundred and four
by and between Walter Wofford of Wagoner, Ind. Ter. part 7 of the first part; and William E. Halsell
of Wagoner, Ind. Ter. part 7 of the second part;

WITNESSETH, That that the said part 7 of the first part, for and in consideration of the sum of
Five Hundred DOLLARS, in hand paid, the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged,
do hereby grant, bargain, sell, convey and confirm unto the said part 7 of the second part the following described real estate and premises situated in the
Cherokee Northern District
Cherokee Nation, and within the limits of the Indian Territory, to-wit:
NE 1/4 of SE 1/4 of Section 09 and SW 1/4 of NW 1/4 of Section 01
Township 02 North Range 04 East.

together with all the improvements thereon, and the appurtenances and immunities thereon to be having or in any wise appertaining thereto.

To have and to hold the aforegranted premises to the said William E. Halsell
and his heirs and successors, in fee simple forever; and the said Walter Wofford and Catherine Wofford
for and their heirs, executors and administrators do covenant with the said
William E. Halsell and his heirs, successors and assigns, that the said Walter Wofford and Catherine Wofford are free from all incumbrances
that the said Walter Wofford and Catherine Wofford have good right to sell and convey the same to said
William E. Halsell as aforesaid; and that the said Walter Wofford and Catherine Wofford will and their successors, heirs, executors and administrators shall warrant and de-
fend the same to the said William E. Halsell
and his heirs, successors and assigns forever against the lawful claims and demands of all persons.

And I, Catherine Wofford of Wagoner, Ind. Ter.
wife of said Walter Wofford, for and in consideration of the said sum of money, do hereby re-
lease and relinquish unto the said part 7 of the second part all my right of dower and homestead in and to the said lands.
