

GENERAL WARRANTY DEED

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This instrument was made and entered into this 12th day of April, one thousand nine hundred and seventy, by Maurice Sheppard, sister of Simon Sheppard, deceased, of Arkansas, part of the first part, and George R. Smith of the Indian Territory, part of the second part;

WITNESS: That that the said part of the first part, for and in consideration of the sum of One Dollar and other valuable considerations DOLLARS, in hand paid, the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged, do hereby grant, bargain, sell, convey and confirm unto the said part of the second part the following described real estate and premises situated in the Cherokee Nation, and within the limits of the Indian Territory, to wit:

One half of Southeast quarter of sec Twenty nine (29) Twp. Twenty
Lands, in the Cherokee Nation, East of the Indian Base and Meridian, and
in the allotment of land in the Cherokee Nation belonging to Simon Sheppard,
deceased, of which estate I am one of the legal heirs at law now living,
together with all the improvements thereon, and the appurtenances and immunities thereunto belonging or in any wise appertaining thereto.

To have and to hold the aforesigned premises to the said George R. Smith,
and his heirs and successors, in fee simple forever; and I the said Maurice Sheppard,
for George R. Smith and my heirs, executors and administrators do covenant with the said George R. Smith,
and his heirs, successors and assigns, that they shall not in any wise interfere with or annoy George R. Smith,
they are free from all incumbrance; that I have good right to sell and convey the same to said

George R. Smith as aforesaid; and that I will and my successors, heirs, executors and administrators shall warrant and defend the same to the said George R. Smith,
and his heirs, successors and assigns forever against the lawful claims and demands of all persons.

And I, wife of said, for and in consideration of the said sum of money, do hereby release and relinquish unto the said part of the second part all my right of dower and homestead in and to the said lands.
