

# GENERAL WARRANTY DEED

WITH RELINQUISHMENT OF DOWER

THIS INDENTURE, Made and entered into this 15<sup>th</sup> day of March, one thousand nine hundred and seven, by and between Luke Bluebird and Mary Bluebird, his wife, of Moody, Ind. Ter., parties of the first part, and George R. Smith of \_\_\_\_\_, party of the second part;

WITNESSETH, That that the said part <sup>iii</sup> of the first part, for and in consideration of the sum of Two hundred no/00 DOLLARS, in hand paid, the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged, do hereby grant, bargain, sell, convey and confirm unto the said part <sup>ii</sup> of the second part the following described real estate and premises situated in the Cherokee Nation, and within the limits of the Indian Territory, to-wit:

Southwest quarter of Southeast quarter of Sec. Thirty six (36) Township Twenty two (22) north Range Thirteen (13) East of the Indian Meridian.

together with all the improvements thereon, and the appurtenances and immunities thereunto belonging or in any wise appertaining thereto.

To have and to hold the aforesigned premises to the said George R. Smith and his heirs and successors, in fee simple forever; and I, the said Luke Bluebird for myself and my heirs, executors and administrators do covenant with the said George R. Smith and his heirs, executors and administrators, that I have lawfully seized in fee of the aforesigned premises; that they are free from all incumbrance, that I have good right to sell and convey the same to said.

George A. Smith, as aforesaid; and that I will and my successors, heirs, executors and administrators shall warrant and defend the same to the said George R. Smith and his heirs, successors and assigns forever against the lawful claims and demands of all persons.

And I, Mary Bluebird, wife of said Luke Bluebird, for and in consideration of the said sum of money, do hereby release and relinquish unto the said part <sup>ii</sup> of the second part all my right of dower and homestead in and to the said lands.
