

GENERAL WARRANTY DEED

WITH RELINQUISHMENT OF DOWER.

THIS INDENTURE, Made and entered into this 19th day of August, one thousand nine hundred and four, by and between Allen James, of Chocotah, I.T., part of the first part, and W.C. Nalell, of Limita, I.T., part of the second part;

WITNESSETH, That that the said part of the first part, for and in consideration of the sum of One hundred & 00/00 DOLLARS, in hand paid, the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged, do hereby grant, bargain, sell, convey and confirm unto the said part of the second part the following described real estate and premises situated in the Cherokee Northern District, ~~Quapaw or Creek Nation, and within the limits of the Indian Territory, to wit:~~
NC 44 of T 74 of Sec 35 T 21 N R. 13 E containing 40 acres.

together with all the improvements thereon, and the appurtenances and immunities thereunto belonging or in anywise appertaining thereto

To have and to hold the aforesigned premises to the said W.C. Nalell, and his heirs and successors, in fee simple forever; and the said Allen James, for myself and my heirs, executors and administrators do covenant with the said W.C. Nalell, and his heirs, successors and assigns, that I have lawfully seized in fee of the aforesigned premises; that they are free from all incumbrances, that I have good right to sell, and convey the same to said

W.C. Nalell, as aforesaid; and that I will and my successors, heirs, executors and administrators shall warrant and defend the same to the said W.C. Nalell, and his heirs, successors and assigns forever against the lawfu claims and demands of all persons.

And I, Eva James, wife of said Allen James, of Chocotah, for and in consideration of the said sum of money, do hereby release and relinquish unto the said part of the second part all my right of dower and homestead in and to the said lands.
