

GENERAL WARRANTY DEED

WITH RELINQUISHMENT OF DOWER

THIS INDENTURE, Made and entered into this 14th day of March, one thousand nine hundred and seven
by and between John Tiger and Louise Tiger his wife of
Morris Indian Territory part 1st of the first part, and James B. Wright
of Muskogee Indian Territory part 4th of the second part;

WITNESSETH, That that the said parties of the first part, for and in consideration of the sum of One Dollar (\$1.00)
and other valuable consideration DOLLARS, in hand paid, the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged,
do hereby grant, bargain, sell, convey and confirm unto the said part of the second part the following de-cried real estate and premises situated in the
Muskogee or Creek Nation, and within the limits of the Indian Territory, to-wit: The west half (1/2) of the south
west quarter (1/4) and the north east quarter (1/4) of the
south west quarter (1/4) of Section Twenty-six (26)
Township eighteen (18) North and Range fourteen
(14) East of the Indian Base and Meridian in Indian
Territory, containing One Hundred and Twenty (120) acres more or less
together with all the improvements thereon, and the appurtenances and immunities thereunto belonging or in anywise appertaining thereto

To have and to hold the aforegranted premises to the said James B. Wright
and his heirs and successors, in fee simple forever; and the said John Tiger and Louise Tiger
his wife and their heirs, executors and administrators do covenant with the said James B. Wright
and his heirs, successors and assigns, that they are lawfully seized in fee of the aforegranted premises; that
they are free from all incumbrance; that they have good right to sell and convey the same to said James B.
Wright as aforesaid; and that they will and their successors, heirs, executors and administrators shall warrant and de-
fend the same to the said James B. Wright
and his heirs, successors and assigns forever against the lawful claims and demands of all persons.

And I, Louise Tiger of Morris I.T.
wife of said John Tiger, for and in consideration of the said sum of money, do hereby re-
lease and relinquish unto the said part 4th of the second part all my right of dower and homestead in and to the said lands.
