

GENERAL WARRANTY DEED

WITNESS WHEREOF, I, the undersigned,

THIS INDENTURE, Made and entered into this 12th day of April, one thousand nine hundred and seven, by and between Ethel Nail, of Tulsa Indian Territory, part of the first part, and George G. Bayne, of Tulsa Ind. Ter., part of the second part.

WITNESS R. H. That that the said part of the first part, for and in consideration of the sum of Fifteen Hundred

DOLLARS, in hand paid, the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged, do as hereby grant, bargain, sell, convey and confirm unto the said part of the second part the following described real estate and premises situated in the Muskogee or Creek Nation, and within the limits of the Indian Territory, to wit: the Northwest quarter (NW^{1/4}) of the Southwest quarter (SW^{1/4}) of Section Two (2) and the Southeast Quarter (SE^{1/4}) of the Northeast quarter (NE^{1/4}); the Northeast quarter (NE^{1/4}) of the Southeast quarter (SE^{1/4}) of the Southwest quarter (SW^{1/4}) of the Southeast quarter (SE^{1/4}); Lot no eight (8) and half (1/2) of Northwest quarter (NW^{1/4}) of the Southeast quarter (SE^{1/4}) of sec. Three (3) all labor land being in township nineteen (19) north Range twelve (12) east in the Creek Nation, Okla.

To have and to hold the aforesigned premises of the said George G. Bayne
and his heirs and successors, in fee simple forever; and the said Ethel Nail, grantor herein
for and her heirs, executors and administrators do covenant with the said George G. Bayne
and his heirs, successors and assigns, that she is lawfully seized in fee of the aforesigned premises; that
they are free from all incumbrances; that she have good right to sell and convey the same to said George G.
Bayne
aforesaid; and that she will and her successors, heirs, executors and administrators shall warrant and defend the same to the said George G. Bayne
and his heirs, successors and assigns forever against the lawful claims and demands of all persons.

And I, Ethel Nail, wife of said James Nail, for and in consideration of the said sum of money, do sac*re* by re-lease and relinquish unto the said part of the second part all my right of dower and homestead in and to the said lands.)
