

GENERAL WARRANTY DEED

WITH RELINQUISHMENT OF DOWER

THIS INDENTURE, Made and entered into this 1st day of July, one thousand nine hundred and seven
 by and between Sam L. Fife, heir of Charles Green, deceased,
OKmulgee, I. T. part 4 of the first part, and E. B. Shotwell
 of OKmulgee, I. T. part 4 of the second part;

WITNESSETH, That that the said part 4 of the first part, for and in consideration of the sum of
 Two Hundred DOLLARS, in hand paid, the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged,
 do es hereby grant, bargain, sell, convey and confirm unto the said part 4 of the second part the following described real estate and premises situated in the
 Muskogee or Creek Nation, and within the limits of the Indian Territory, to-wit: The East half (1/2) of the Southwest
 Quarter (1/4) of Section Three (3) Township (18) North and Range Fourteen
 (14) East of the Julian Base and Meridian in the Indian Territory,
 and containing eighty acres, more or less, said land being a part of the
 allotment of Charles Green, deceased and the grantor herein being the
 half brother of said Charles Green, deceased together with all the improvements thereon, and the appurtenances and immunities thereon to be ongoing or in anywise appertaining thereto

To have and to hold the aforesigned premises of the said E. B. Shotwell
 and his assigns
 and his heirs and successors; in fee simple forever; and to the said Sam L. Fife
 for myself and my heirs, executors and administrators do covenant with the said E. B. Shotwell
 and his heirs, successors and assigns, that I lawfully seized in fee of the aforesigned premises; that
 they are free from all incumbrances; that I have good right to sell and convey the same to said E. B. Shotwell
 as aforesaid; and that I will and my successors, heirs, executors and administrators shall warrant and defend the same to the said E. B. Shotwell
 and his heirs, successors and assigns forever against the lawful claims and demands of all persons.

And I, wife of said, for and in consideration of the said sum of money, do hereby release and relinquish unto the said part 4 of the second part all my right of dower and homestead in and to the said lands.
