**THIS INDENTURE**, Made and entered into this 25<sup>th</sup> day of June, one thousand nine hundred and four,  
by and between Anderson Lynch  
C. Lafferty & Co. Jerry part 4 of the first part, and W. P. Phillips  
of Vinita part 4 of the second part;

WITNESSETH, That that the said part 4 of the first part, for and in consideration of the sum of  
Five hundred DOLLARS, in hand paid, the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged,  
does hereby grant, bargain, sell, convey and confirm unto the said part 4 of the second part the following described real estate and premises situated in the  
Cherokee <sup>Northern District</sup> ~~McGees~~ or Creek Nation, and within the limits of the Indian Territory, to wit: The NE 1/4 of the SW 1/4 of Section 29  
J 21 N T 3 E

together with all the improvements thereon, and the appurtenances and immunities thereunto belonging or in any wise appertaining thereto

To have and to hold the aforesigned premises to the said W. P. Phillips  
and his heirs and successors, in fee simple forever; and I the said Anderson Lynch  
for himself and our <sup>Cherokee</sup> heirs, executors and administrators do covenant with the said W. P. Phillips <sup>Cherokee</sup> that we are recognized, unceas'd, and approved Friends of the Cherokee  
and his heirs, successors and assigns, that we lawfully seized in fee of the aforesigned premises; that we <sup>Cherokee</sup>  
they are free from all incumbrances; I have good right to sell and convey the same to said

W. P. Phillips <sup>as aforesaid</sup>; and that I will and my successors, heirs, executors and administrators shall warrant and defend the same to the said W. P. Phillips

and his heirs, successors and assigns forever against the lawful claims and demands of all persons.

And I, Ruth B. Lynch of Vinita <sup>Cherokee</sup>, wife of said Anderson Lynch, for and in consideration of the said sum of money, do hereby release and relinquish unto the said part 4 of the second part all my right of dower and homestead in and to the said lands.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, the said part 4 of the first part has hereunto set his hand and seal the day and year first above written.
