

GENERAL WARRANTY DEED

WITH RELINQUISHMENT OF DOWER

THIS INDENTURE, Made and entered into this 13th day of January, one thousand nine hundred and five by and between Lena Ward of Centralia Ind. Ter. part 1/2 of the first part, and W. P. Phillips and T. M. Buffington of Vinita Ind. Ter. part 1/2 of the second part;

WITNESSETH, That that the said part 1/2 of the first part, for and in consideration of the sum of Four hundred and thirty DOLLARS, in hand paid, the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged, do hereby grant, bargain, sell, convey and confirm unto the said part 1/2 of the second part the following described real estate and premises situated in the Cherokee Northern District Muscogee or Creek Nation, and within the limits of the Indian Territory, to-wit:

West 1/2 of S.W. 1/4 of S.E. 1/4 of section 29 Township 21 North Range 13 East and East 1/2 of N.W. 1/4 of section 32, Township 21 Range 13 East

together with all the improvements thereon, and the appurtenances and immunities thereunto belonging or in anywise appertaining thereto

To have and to hold the aforesigned premises of the said W. P. Phillips and T. M. Buffington and their heirs and successors, in fee simple forever; and I, the said Lena Ward for myself and my heirs, executors and administrators do covenant with the said W. P. Phillips and T. M. Buffington and their heirs, successors and assigns, that I am lawfully seized in fee of the aforesigned premises; that they are free from all incumbrance; that I have good right to sell and convey the same to said W. P. Phillips and T. M. Buffington and T. M. Buffington aforesaid; and that I will and my successors, heirs, executors and administrators shall warrant and defend the same to the said W. P. Phillips and T. M. Buffington and their heirs, successors and assigns forever against the lawful claims and demands of all persons.

And I, Lena Ward, wife of said, for and in consideration of the said sum of money, do hereby release and relinquish unto the said part 1/2 of the second part all my right of dower and homestead in and to the said lands.
