

GENERAL WARRANTY DEED

THIS INDENTURE, made and entered into this 9th day of August, one thousand nine hundred and seven, by and between John Tiger, of the Creek National Agency, part of the first part, and A. A. Kinney, part of the second part;

WITNESSETH, That that the said party of the first part, for and in consideration of the sum of Ten Dollars and other valuable considerations, DOLLARS, in hand paid, the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged,

do hereby grant, bargain, sell, convey and confirm unto the said party of the second part the following described real estate and premises situated in the

Muskogee or Creek Nation, and within the limits of the Indian Territory, to-wit: The North half ($\frac{1}{2}$) of the South West Quarter ($\frac{1}{4}$) and the South West Quarter ($\frac{1}{4}$) of the South West Quarter ($\frac{1}{4}$) of section Twenty Six (26) Township Eighteen (18) North, Range Fourteen (14) East of the Indian Reserve and Meridian of the Indian Territory containing One Hundred Twenty (120) acres more or less as per the Plat together with all the improvements thereon, and the appurtenances and immunities thereon belonging or in any wise appertaining thereto.

To have and to hold the aforesigned premises to the said A. A. Kinney and his heirs and successors, in fee simple forever; and the said The first party, the said John Tiger, for and his heirs, executors and administrators do covenant with the said A. A. Kinney and his heirs, successors and assigns, that he is lawfully seized in fee of the aforesigned premises; that they are free from all incumbrance; that he has good right to sell and convey the same to said A. A. Kinney as aforesaid; and that he will and his successors, heirs, executors and administrators shall warrant and defend the same to the said A. A. Kinney and his heirs, successors and assigns forever against the law's claims and demands of all persons.

And I, wife of said party of the second part all my right of dower and homestead in and to the said lands, release and relinquish unto the said party of the second part all my right of dower and homestead in and to the said lands.
