

GENERAL WARRANTY DEED

WITH EQUITABLE TITLE TO POWER

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THIS INDENTURE, Made and entered into this 12th day of August, one thousand nine hundred and seven, and between Jennie D. Dunn, a single woman, of the first part, and Western Land Co. of Milwaukee, of the second part;

WITNESSETH, That that the said part, of the first part, for and in consideration of the sum of sixteen hundred and fifty DOLLARS, in hand paid, the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged,

do hereby grant, bargain, sell, convey and confirm unto the said part, of the second part the following described real estate and premises situated in the Muskogee or Creek Nation, and within the limits of the Indian Territory, to wit:

The SW 1/4 of the SE 1/4, the S 1/2 of the N 1/4 of the SW 1/4 of the SE 1/4, the S 1/4 of the SW 1/4, all in section 18 (17) Township 48 North, Range 13 East, containing 80 acres more or less according to the United States Government Survey thereof

together with all the improvements thereon, and the appurtenances and immunities therein belonging or in any wise appertaining thereto.

To have and to hold the aforesigned premises to the said parties of the second part

their heirs and successors, in fee simple forever; and at the said Jennie Dunn

for myself and my heirs, executors and administrators do covenant with the said Western Land Co.

and their heirs, successors and assigns, that I lawfully seized in fee of the aforesigned premises; that

this are free from all incumbrance; that I have good right to sell, and convey the same to said Western

Land Co.; and that I will and my successors, heirs, executors and administrators shall warrant and de-

fend the same to the said Western Land Co.

and their heirs, successors and assigns forever against the law's claims and demands of all persons.

And I, wife of said, for and in consideration of the said sum of money, do hereby re-

lease and relinquish unto the said part, of the second part all my right of dower and homestead in and to the said lands.
