

## GENERAL WARRANTY DEED

WITNESSED IN THE PRESENCE OF JAMES

**THIS INDENTURE**, Made and entered into this 5<sup>th</sup> day of August, one thousand nine hundred and seven, by and between Ben White, heir at law of Garrison Wallace, deceased, his wife, and the Commercial Land Company, a corporation, whose true name and place of business is Muskogee, Okla.

WITNESSETH, That that the said part of the first part, for and in consideration of the sum of One dollar and other valuable consideration, DOLLARS, in hand paid, the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged, do hereby grant, bargain, sell, convey and confirm unto the said part of the second part the following described real estate and premises situated in the Muskogee or Creek Nation, and within the limits of the Indian Territory, to wit: All his right, title and interest in and to the South West Quarter (S. W. 1/4) of the South East Quarter (S. E. 1/4) of section eight (8), Township seventeen (17) North, Range Twenty (27) East, and containing forty (40) acres, more or less, and being a part of the allotment, exclusive of homestead, of Garrison Wallace deceased together with all the improvements thereon, and the appurtenances and immunities thereunto belonging or in anywise appertaining thereto.

To have and to hold the aforesigned premises to the said Commercial Land Company and its heirs and assigns, in fee simple forever; and the said Ben White, for myself and my heirs, executors and administrators do covenant with the said Commercial Land Company and its heirs, successors and assigns, that claim lawfully seized in fee of the aforesigned premises, that they are free from all incumbrance, and that I have good right to sell and convey the same to said Commercial Land Company, and that my heirs and administrators shall warrant and defend the same to the said Commercial Land Company and its heirs, successors and assigns forever against the lawful claims and demands of all persons.

And I, wife of said, for and in consideration of the said sum of money, do hereby release and relinquish unto the said part of the second part all my right of dower and homestead in and to the said lands.
