The conditions of the foregoing obligation are such that whereas judgment was rendered in favor of the said obligee, defendant in error herein by the District court of Okmulgee County, Oklahoma, and against the Sequoyah Oil & Refining Company, a corporation, the principal obligor herein, for the sum of \$12621, 82, with interest at 6% and the costs; and

WHEREAS, the plaintiff in error herein superseded said judgment with a supersedeas bond and appealed said action to the Supreme Court of the State of Oklahoma. That said action is now pending in the Supreme Court of the State of Oklahoma; and

WHEREAS, on the 28th day of March, 1922, the Supreme Court of the State of Oklahoma, made and entered an order requiring the plaintiff in error, Sequoyah Oil & Refining Company, a corporation, to file a new supersedeas bond in lieu of all other bonds, in the sum of \$30,000.00, to be approved by the Court Clerk of Okmulgee County, Oklahoma.

NOW, THEREFORE, if the principal obligor herein shall pay to the said obligee the condemnation money and interests and costs in case the judgment or final order shall be adjudged against it or affirmed in whole or in part, and that it will make an accounting as ordered by the court, then this obligation shall be void; otherwise to remain in full force and effect.
