This Indenture made this the 7th day of July, A. D. 1922, by and between
 Burris Doyle and Eula Doyle, husband and wife, for themselves, and Burris Doyle, former
 Guardian and present trustee for his two minor children Eva Doyle and Walter Doyle, join-
 ed by his wife, Eula Doyle, and Eva Skaggs and J. K. Skaggs, husband and wife, all of
 Tulsa County, in the State of Oklahoma, Parties of the first part and Ada Higbee, party
 of the second part WITNESSETH:

That heretofore, and on the 15th day of December, 1910, ~~the lands~~ ^{lands} hereinafter
 described were conveyed by General Warranty Deed to Burris Doyle, as guardian for his
 two minor children, Eva Doyle and Walter Doyle, and he now holds the title to the said
 lands as trustee for his said two children, and,

WHEREAS, Walter Doyle is now deceased, having departed this life on the 2nd
 day of June, 1922, single, and unmarried, and without issue, leaving surviving him his
 father, Burris Doyle and mother, Mrs. Ada Highbee, formerly Mrs. Ada Doyle, as his sole
