THIS INDENTURE, Made this 12th day of July, A. D. 1923, between Florence Durham formerly Florence Farr, and her husband Edgar Durham, of Tulsa County, in the State of Oklahoma, parties of the first part, and Everett Manning, Tulsa, Oklahoma, of the second part: WITNESSETH, That said parties of the first part, in consideration of the sum of one hundred eighty and no/100 Dollars, the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged, do by these presents grant, bargain, sell and convey unto said parties of the second part, his heirs and assigns, all the following described real estate situated in Tulsa County and State of Oklahoma, to-wit:

All of lot numbered three (3) in Block numbered twenty four (24) West Tulsa addition to the City of Tulsa, according to the recorded plat thereof,

This conveyance is intended as a mortgage to secure the payment of one promissory note of even date herewith. One for \$180.00 due July 12, 1924.

Said first parties hereby covenant that they are owner, in fee simple of said premises and that they are free and clear of all incumbrances.

That they have good right and authority to convey and encumber the same, and will warrant and defend the same against the lawful claims of all persons whomsoever. Said first parties agree to insure the buildings on said premises in the sum of \$1,000.00 for the benefit of the mortgagee and maintain such insurance during the existence of this mortgage. Said first parties agree to pay all taxes and assessments lawfully assessed on said premises before delinquent.

Said first parties further expressly agree that in case of foreclosure of this mortgage, and as often as any proceeding shall be taken to foreclose same as herein provided, the mortgagor will pay to the said mortgagee two hundred fifty Dollars as attorney's or solicitor's fees therefor, in addition to all other statutory fees; said fee to be due and payable upon the filing of the petition for foreclosure and the same shall be a further charge and lien upon said premises described in this mortgage, and the amount thereon shall be recovered in said foreclosure suit and included in any judgment or decree rendered in action as aforesaid, and collected, and the lien thereof enforced in the same manner as the principal debt hereby secured.

Now if said first parties shall pay or cause to be paid to said second party his heirs or assigns said sum of money in the above described note mentioned, together with the interest thereon according to the terms and tenor of said note, and shall make and maintain such insurance and pay such taxes and assessments then these presents shall be wholly discharged and void, otherwise shall remain in full force and effect. If said insurance is not effected and maintained, or if any and all taxes and assessments which are or may be levied and assessed lawfully against said premises, or any part thereof, are not paid before delinquent, then the mortgagee may effect such insurance or pay such taxes and assessments and shall be allowed interest thereon at the rate of ten per cent per annum, until paid, and this mortgage shall stand as security for all such payments; and if said sum or sums of money or any part thereof is not paid when due, or if such insurance is not effected and maintained or any taxes or assessments are not paid before delinquent, the holder of said note, and this mortgage may elect to declare the whole sum or sums and interest thereon due and payable at once and proceed to collect said debt including attorney's fees, and to foreclose this mortgage, and shall become entitled to possession of said premises.

Said first parties waive notice of election to declare the whole debt due as above and also the benefit to stay, valuation or appraisal laws.
