

Right of Way Deed

This indenture made this 9th day of Nov AD 1907 between Max Rothpletz and Bertha Rothpletz his wife of Tulsa in the Western District of the Indian Territory parties of the first part and The St. Louis and San Francisco Railroad Company a corporation party of the second part. Witnesseth that whereas the said parties of the first part for and in consideration of the sum of One hundred and Sixty Dollars to them in hand paid by said party of the second part the receipt whereof is hereby duly acknowledged have sold and by these presents do give grant bargain sell convey and confirm unto the said party of the second part its successors and assigns in fee simple forever all that tract or parcel of land situated in the Creek Nation of the Indian Territory according to the United States survey and official plat thereof approved by the Secretary of the Interior of the United States bounded and described as follows:

a Tract of land situated in the north-east-quarter of the southwest quarter of section three (3) township nineteen (19) north Range thirteen 13 east in the Creek Nation and more particularly described as follows:

Beginning at the northeast corner of the southwest quarter of section three (3) township and range aforesaid thence west along the east and west center line of section three (3) a distance of four hundred and fifty (450) feet thence in a southerly direction and making an angle of 85 degrees and 15 minutes with east described course, a distance of thirteen hundred and twenty (1320) feet more or less to the south line of the north east quarter of southwest quarter of said section three (3) thence west along the south line of the northeast quarter of southwest quarter of said section three (3) a distance of one hundred and two (102) feet thence northerly and making an angle of 85 degrees and 15 minutes with east described course a distance of thirteen hundred and twenty (1320) feet more or less to the east and west center line of section three (3) aforesaid thence east
