

Power of Attorney.

To exercise a general supervision therefor, and to take full possession thereof at anytime I might otherwise take such possession myself, giving my said attorney full power to do everything whatsoever, requisite and necessary to be done in the premises, as fully as I could do if personally present, with full power of substitution, and revocation, hereby ratifying and confirming all that my said attorney, or his substitute, shall lawfully do, or cause to be done by virtue hereof.
