

Whereas on the 17th day of April, 1913, E. L. Donahoe and J. J. Donahoe and J. L. Donahoe, made, executed and delivered to A. H. Black, J. A. Sivals, E. F. Black and W. G. Bryson a certain oil and gas mining lease covering the following described land in the County of Tulsa and State of Oklahoma, to-wit:

The North half of the Northwest quarter and That Southeast quarter of the Northwest quarter of Section Seventeen Twp 17 North, of Range Thirteen, east, less one acre in the Northwest corner reserved for school purposes.

Said lease being recorded in the office of the County Clerk of said County in Book 129 at page 123, and:

Whereas, the Brooklyn Oil and Gas Company, a common law trust, is the present owner of an undivided three fourths interest in and to the above described leases to the extent and in so far as they cover the following described land, to-wit:

Beginning at the Northwest corner of said Section Seventeen, thence east along the section line four hundred sixty-six and seven tenths feet, thence south four hundred sixty-six and seven tenths feet, thence west four hundred sixty six and seven tenths feet and thence north along the section line four hundred sixty-six and seven tenths feet to point of beginning, containing five acres more or less.

Now Therefore, for and in consideration of One Dollar and other good and valuable consideration, the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged, the said Brooklyn Oil and Gas Company does hereby bargain, sell, transfer, assign and convey unto John M. Woodard, trustee, his successors and assigns, an undivided Five -Sixteenths interest and title in and to said original leases and rights there under in so far as they cover the land last above described.

And for the same consideration the said Brooklyn Oil and Gas Company does hereby covenant with the said John M. Woodard, trustee, that it is the owner of the interest in said leases hereby conveyed and that it has good right and lawful authority to sell assign, and convey the same, and that said interests are free and clear of all liens and incumbrances, and that all rentals and royalties due and payable have been paid.

This assignment is made and executed in pursuance and as directed by resolution of the trustees of the said Brooklyn Oil and Gas Company.
