 she is a person of lawful age, that she is and has been for fifteen
 years last past a resident of Tulsa, Tulsa County, State of Oklahoma and further deposes
 and states she is the full owner of Lot One (1) in Block Fiftyfour (54) in the original
 Town of Tulsa Oklahoma that a certain deed dated November 8- 1902, filed April 30-1904
 in the office of the U.S. Clerk and Ex-Officio recorder at Sapulpa Indian Territory,
 in Book O. Page 85, made and executed by W.F. Jones and Lollie F. Jones in favor of C.F.
 Parker purporting to cover certain property in Sam Davis Addition to town of Tulsa
 does not cover Lot One in Block Fifty four in the original town of Tulsa as surveyed
 and platted by the United States of America and sold by patent of the Muskogee Creek
 Nation dated January 17- 1903, and filed March 24-1903 in the office of the Dawes Commission
 in Muskogee Indian Territory and recorded in Book C, page 340, and that, furthermore,
