WHEREAS, It was provided by said Act of Congress that each member of said tribe shall, at the time of the selection of his allotment, designate, or have selected and designated for him, from his allotment land equal in value to forty acres of the average allottable lands of the Cherokee Nation, as nearly as may be, as a homestead, for which separate certificate shall issue, and,

WHEREAS, The said Commission to the Five Civilized Tribes, or its lawful successor, has certified that the land hereinafter described has been selected by or on behalf of Fern Brown a citizen of said tribe as a homestead,

Now Therefore, I, the undersigned the Principal Chief of the Cherokee Nation, by virtue of the power and authority vested in me by the aforesaid Act of the Congress of the United States, have granted and conveyed, and by these presents do grant and convey unto the said Fern <sup>B</sup>rown all right, title and interest of the Cherokee Nation, and of all other citizens of said Nation, in and to the following described land viz:

Half of the South West Quarter of the Southeast quarter of

Section Eighteen (18) Township Twenty Two (22) North Lange Fourteen (14) East.

of the Indian Base and Meridian, in Oklahora containing thirty (30) acres, more or less, as the case may be, according to the United States survey thereof, subject however, to the conditions provided by said Act. of Congress, pertaining to allotted homesteads.
