Whereas Vennie Leaf, now Chewey a citizen of the Cherokee Nation, was allotted the following described land, to-wit:

Southwest quarter (SW4) of Northeast quarter (NE4); South half (S2) of Northwest quarter (NW4) of Northeast quarter (NE4); Northeast quarter (NE4) of Northwest quarter (NW4) of Northeast quarter (NE4) and Southwest quarter (SW4) of Southeast quarter (SE4) of Northeast quarter (NE4) of Section Seven (7), Township Twenty-one (21) North, Range Fourteen (14) East of the Indian Base and Meridian-containing 80 acres, more or less, located in Tulsa County, Oklahoma.
