That said Margaret Atkins Parks is a citizen of the Creek Nation, being a one eighth blood Creek Indian; that these affiants are the father and mother of Chaney Parks deceased, who was a Creek Citizen duly enrolled and was allotted the South half of the South west quarter of section 25, Township eighteen (18) north and range 12 east, and the north west quarter of section 36 and the north east quarter of the south west quarter of section 25, Township 18 north and range 12 East. Affiants further state that their daughter Chaney Parks died on the 12th day of October, 1901, at the age of eight or nine years, without issue; that she was the legitimate child of these affiants, and further affiants saith not.
