

special mode of sale was required - by said writ of the said decedent, and that said sale was legally made and fairly conducted, that the sum paid was more than 90% of the appraised value of said lot, and that no greater sum than was specified - could be obtained; and,

It further appearing to the Court that the said executor filed the return of said proceedings of said sale on the - day of May, 1905, as stated herein, and, It further having been proved to the satisfaction of the Court that pursuant to the order of the Court made on the - day of May, 1905, and the statute of Oklahoma in such case made - and provided, there was published in the Tulsa Daily Oklawaha a newspaper published daily in the County of Tulsa, State of Oklahoma, for a period of ten days before the said 6th day of June, 1905, a notice that the executor named, on the said 6th day of June, 1905, apply for the confirmation of the said sale of the said property herein situated, - and, It further having been proved to the satisfaction of the Court that the said notice properly described the lands herein mentioned, properly stated the price for which the same were sold, and in all ways conformed to the order of the Court and the statute of Oklahoma, and, It further having been proved to the satisfaction of the Court by the affidavit of William W. H. H. editor and publisher of the Tulsa Daily Oklawaha, that the said notice was published the time required by the said order and statute; and
