 It further appearing to the Court that the said
 execution filed her return of said proceedings of said
 sale on the 25th day of May, 1905, as a return, and
 It further having been found to the satisfaction of
 the Court that pursuant to the order of this Court
 made on the 25th day of May, 1905, and the
 State of Oklahoma in such cases made and
 provided, there was published in the Tulsa Daily
 Democrat, a newspaper published daily in the
 County of Tulsa, State of Oklahoma, for a period of
 ten days before the said 5th day of June, 1905, a notice
 that the execution would, on the said 6th day of
 June, 1905, apply for the confirmation of the said sale
 of the said property herein described; and
 It further having been found to the satisfaction of
 the Court that the said notice properly states the price
 and terms mentioned, properly states the price
 for which the same was sold, and in all ways
 conform to the order of this Court and the Statute
 of Oklahoma; and,
 It further having been found to the satisfaction of
 the Court by the affidavit of William Shaffer,
 editor and publisher of the Tulsa Daily Democrat,
 that the said notice was published the time
 and place provided;
 Now on motion of Martin & Rice, attorneys for
 plaintiff, it is ruled and adjudged that the
