 by and between Benjamin D. Colley, of the City of Tulsa,
 Party of the first part and C. M. Lancaster, J. M. Brown,
 L. H. Cone and G. P. McCullough, of the City of Tulsa,
 Parties of the second part; Witnesseth

That for and in consideration of the sum of \$100, and
 other good and valuable considerations, receipt whereof
 is hereby acknowledged, the said Party of the first part
 assigns, transfers and sets over unto the said Parties
 of the second part all his right, title and interest which
 may have accrued to him in a certain option decreed
 by Rachel Perryman on the 25th day of July, A.D. 1903,
 wherein the said Rachel Perryman agreed to transfer
 to the said Benjamin D. Colley, a certain tract of land
 described as follows:

One block of ground 300 feet by 300 feet out of said
 Rachel Perryman's allotment of Geo. B. Perryman deceased.
 Said allotment adjoining the south line of the townsite
 of Tulsa, D. T., and which option was filed for record
 in the office of the Deputy Clerk of the United States
 Court and ex-officio recorder at Tulsa, D. T. on March 18,
 1907 at 2:30 o'clock P.M.
