the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, said part Y of the first part do by these presents grant, bargain, sell and convey unto said part Y of the second part his heirs and assigns, all of the following described real estate, situated in the County of Tulsa, State of Oklahoma, to wit:

according to the recorded plat thereof.

INTERNAL REVENUE

To Have and To Hold the Same, Together with all and singular the tenements, hereditaments and appurtenances thereto belonging or in anywise appertaining, forever.

And said Gentry Hancock a widow and her heirs, executors or administrators, do hereby covenant, promise and agree to and with said part Y of the second part that at the delivery of these presents that she lawfully seized in her own right of an absolute and indefeasible estate of inheritance in fee simple, of and in all and singular the above granted and described premises, with the appurtenances; that the same are free, clear and discharged and unincumbered of and from all former and other grants, titles, charges, estates, judgments, taxes and assessments and incumbrances of whatsoever nature and kind, EXCEPT.

and that she will warrant and forever defend the same unto the said part Y of the second part his heirs and assigns against said part Y of the first part her heirs and assigns, and all and every person or persons whomsoever, lawfully claiming or to claim the same.
