THIS INDENTURE, Made this 7th day of December A. D. 1922 between S. W. Parish, Theodore Cox and Nettie F. Castle, of Tulsa County, State of Oklahoma parties, of the first part, and Noah C. Adams Party of the second part

WITNESSETH, That said part 1st of the first part, in consideration of the sum of One Dollar and other good and valuable considerations to them duly paid, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, do hereby quit-claim, grant bargain, sell and convey unto the said part 2nd of the second part, and to his heirs and assigns forever, all their right, title, interest and estate, both at law and in equity, of, in and to the following described real estate in the County of Tulsa and State of Oklahoma to-wit:

Lot Six (6) in Block One (1) in Ridgewood Addition to the City of Tulsa, according to the recorded plat thereof.

This deed is given to release and quitclaim any and all rights which parties of the first part may or might have in and to the above described land by virtue of a provision for forfeiture upon breach or violation of any of the conditions or restrictions contained in a deed conveying said land, given by parties of the first part to the party of the second part, dated December 29, 1921, and recorded in Book 383, at page 466 in the office of the County Clerk of said County and State, it being understood however that said restrictions are to remain in force and effect.

It is further understood and agreed that said restrictions above mentioned are covenants and shall run with the land, and either the grantors herein or any owner of real estate in said addition, shall have the right to enforce said restrictions in any court of competent jurisdiction, either by suit or injunction, to prevent the violation of such restrictions, or to recover damages for violation thereof.

Together with all and singular the hereditaments and appurtenances there unto belonging. To have and to hold the above granted premises unto the said party of the second part his heirs and assigns forever.
