

and Lot One in Block Three between Fifteenth and Seventeenth Streets in Liberty Place (Maywood Addition) as shown in recorded plat of Liberty Place (Maywood Addition) City of Tulsa, Oklahoma, be and the same is hereby vacated and abandoned as a public street of said city, provided, however the City of Tulsa hereby reserves and shall retain forever, the right to construct, reconstruct, repair, maintain and operate sanitary sewers and other appurtenances thereto appertaining now located in said street or which of necessity should be constructed or maintained in said streets with the right of ingress and egress over said premises for the purposes above indicated, over and upon that portion of the above described street included in the South 7 (seven feet) and 6" (six inches) thereof and described as a strip of land bounded by a line commencing at the Northwest corner of Lot 1 Block 3, Liberty Place (Maywood Addition) City of Tulsa, Oklahoma; running thence East along the North line of said Lot 1 Block 3 to the Northeast corner of said lot; running thence in a Northerly direction and along the extension of the East line of said Lot 1, Block 3, a distance of 7' (seven feet) and 6" (six inches); running thence in a Westerly direction and parallel with the North line of said Lot 1 Block 3, a distance of 155' (one hundred fifty-five feet) and 5" (five inches); running thence in a Southerly direction to the point of beginning, and said strip of land is hereby maintained by the city of Tulsa, upon which said City of Tulsa may allow public service corporations, companies, individuals or itself to construct, maintain and operate facilities for public utilities and including poles, wires, pipes, conduits and other necessary accessories; and,

Provided, further that the above vacation is made subject to the conditions and provisions of Paragraph 11, Section 6, Article 11 of the Charter of the City of Tulsa.

SECTION 2: That all ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict with the provisions of this ordinance insofar as such conflict exists are hereby repealed.

SECTION 3: That an emergency exists for the preservation of the public welfare and safety by reason whereof this ordinance shall take effect from and after its passage, approval and publication.

PASSED, and the emergency clause ruled upon separately and approved, this 26th day of September, 1922.
