## ORDINANCE NO. 2353.

An Ordinance vacating a strip of ground 11.12 feet wide which is the North 11.12 feet of Sixteenth Street as it passes from the East line of Victor Avenue, through lots 14, 15, 16, 17, 18, 19, 20, 21, 22, 23, 24, 25, 26, 27, 28, 29, 30 and 31 of Terrace Park Addition to the City of Tulsa, Oklahoma, with certain reservations and declaring an emergency.

WHEREAS, it appears that by two separate dedications Sixteenth Street as it now passes through Terrace Park Addition from Victor Avenue to the East line of Lot 31, Block 1, Terrace Park Addition is 41.12 feet wide.

WHEREAS, it further appears that it was the intention of the grantors of the deeds of the dedication to only make a street 30 feet wide.

WHEREAS, it appears that a thirty-foot street is all that is now used, occupied and necessary for a public street at this location.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF TULSA, OKLAHOMA:

Section 1. That a strip of ground 11.12 feet wide, same being the North 11.12 feet of Sixteenth Street as it passes through Block 1, Terrace Park Addition to the City of Tulsa, Oklahoma, said strip of land being more particularly described: Beginning at a point on the West line of Lot 14, Block 1, Terrace Park Addition 69.68 feet south of the NW corner of said lot; thence due East through Lots 14 to 31 inclusive, parallel to the North line of said lots; thence South along the East line of Lot 31, Block 1, Terrace Park Addition 11.12 feet; thence due West parallel to the North line of said lots to the West line of Lot 14, Block 1, Terrace Park Addition; thence due North along the West line of Lot 14, Block 1, Terrace Park Addition to the City of Tulsa, Oklahoma, to the point of beginning; be and the same is hereby vacated and abandoned as a public street of the City of Tulsa, Oklahoma. Provided, however, the City of Tulsa hereby reserves and retains forever, the right to repair, maintain and operate sanitary sewers or other appurtenances thereto that might be located in said street with the right of ingress and egress over said premises for the purpose above indicated.

Provided, further, that the above vacation is made subject to the conditions and provisions of Paragraph Eleven (11), Section Six (6), Article Two (2) of the Charter of the City of Tulsa.

Section 2.-That all ordinances or parts or ordinances in conflict with the provisions of this ordinance insofar as such conflicts exists are hereby repealed.

Section 3.- That an emergency exists for the preservation of the public welfare and safety by reason whereof this ordinance shall take effect from and after its passage, approval and publication.

PASSED, and the emergency clause ruled upon separately and approved this 8th day of December, 1922. *Approved this 8th day of December 1922*
