INTERNAL REVIEW

THIS INSTRUMENT, Made this 27th day of October A. D. 1922, between G. C. Packard and Lula B. Packard, his wife, of Fort Smith, Arkansas, of the first part, and Chester Frazier of the second part.

WITNESSETH, The said parties of the first part, in consideration of six Hundred and no/100 DOLLARS the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged, do by these presents grant, bargain, sell and convey unto the said party of the second part, his heirs and assigns, all of the following described real estate, situated in the County of Tulsa, and State of Oklahoma, to-wit: Lot 5, B- 8 in East Highland, an Addition to the city of Tulsa, Tulsa County, Oklahoma, according to the duly recorded plat of same.

To have and to hold the same, together with all and singular the tenements, hereditaments and appurtenances thereunto belonging or in any wise appertaining forever- And I, the said G. C. Packard for myself and for my heirs, administrators and assigns, do hereby covenant, promise and agree to and with said party of the second part, that at the delivery of these presents I was lawfully seized in my right of an absolute and indefeasible state of inheritance, in fee simple, of, in and to all and singular the
