Whiting, deceased, by way of final report herein respectfully shows to the court that under the provisions of the Will of said decedent, which has been duly probated, said decedent directed that all his just debts and funeral expenses be paid out of his estate and after the payment of said such debts and funeral expenses, all his property, both real and personal should go to the surviving Widow, Mary Whiting, who is the executrix named in said will; that said decedent's estate consisted of personal property in the form of notes and war savings stamps aggregating \$2500.00 and a small piece of real estate of the value of approximately \$100.00 and that therefore there was no inheritance tax to be paid on said estate.

Said executrix would further show to the court that she has paid the funeral expenses of said decedent, all the debts filed against said estaa and all debts coming to her knowledge and that she has paid the costs of administration and files herewith the receipts for said costs of administration; that she has delivered over to herself as surviving widow and as sole legatee and devisee adder said will all of said estate, remaining after the payment of debts, claims and charges and hereby individually acknowledge receipt thereof from herself as executrix.

That nothing further remains to be done in the settlement of said estate; that more than one year has elapsed since her appointment and since the publication of the notice of her appointment as such executrix.

Wherefore she asks that this her final report may be approved and that she be finally discharged from her said trust.
