IN THE COUNTY COURT IN AND FOR CREEK COUNTY, STATE OF OKLAHOMA. IN THE MATTER OF THE ESTATE OF KA-LA-WEE, DECEASED. ORDER APPROVING DEED.

Now on this 15th day of August, 1932, this matter coming on to be heard on the petition of Maxie Wildcat, one of the heirs of Ka-la-wee, deceased, for the approval of this deed to Vera Stickle. And there now appearing Vera Stickle in person and by her attorney, James H. Sykes, and there also appearing Honorable Peter Deichman, United States Probate Attorney, and there also appearing Maxie Wildcat, in person, and the matter being submitted to the Court, the Court finds;

That Maxie Wildcat is a full blood Creek Indian enrolled upon the final citizenship rolls of the Creek Nation of Indians opposite Roll No. 9662; That Ka-la-wee was a duly enrolled full blood Creek Indian, and that by reason of such enrollment she had allotted to her the following described land, to-wit:

The North Half of the Southeast Quarter, and the South Half of the South Half of the Southwest Quarter of the Northeast Quarter of Section Thirty Two, Township Nineteen North, Range Twelve East, of the Indian Base and Meridian, less the right of way of the St. Louis and San Francisco Railway
