Capahney Snow, Roll No 6648; who each inherited an one-half of said Kalawee's estate at her death, under and by virtue of the law of descent and distribution in force, to-wit: Mansfield's Digest of the Laws of Arkansas, as and supplemented by Sec. 6 of the Supplemental Creek, the Creek Law;

That her selection of allotment was made, Feb. 18th, 1902, also under the Creek Law; That both at the time of her death July 1st, 1901, and although she having enrolled April 24th 1901, and the date of the selection and issuance of her Certificate of Allotment, Feb 18th, 1902, the Creek Law was in force and would govern the devolution and descent of her entire estate. The above named husband, being her lawful and recognized husband was entitled to one-half, there being no children, and Capahny Snow, a brother, being the nearest relative at the time of death and of selection of allotment, took the other half of said estate.

The Court further finds, however, that all the collateral heirs, or children and grand children of deceased brothers and sisters have joined in conveyances, and by approval and sales of the County C ourt of this County as appears from the records, their interests, if any they could take has passed to their grantees of record.

That the land allotted to Kalawee were; No of N. W. $\frac{1}{4}$ of Sec. 8 Twp. 19N. Rg 9E. and No of SEt less 10.56 A. Right of Way, St.L & S.F. RY., and S $\frac{1}{4}$ of Si $\frac{1}{4}$ of NE of Sec. 32. Twp. 19N RG 12E.

That the time for administration for said estate has elapsed, and there has been no administration, and is now no cause for any. That all proceedings nerein are regular and petitioners are entitled to have a decree rendered herein determining heirship.

It is therefore, ordered, adjudged, and decreed, by the Court that the above and fore-going be and are hereby entered of record as the judgment and decree of the Court in the premises. To be entered and recorded as of Oct. 12, 1920.
