DECREE OF SETTLEMENT OF ESTATE AND DISTRIBUTION

Now on this the 11th day of April, A.D. 1921, this matter comong on for hearing upon the Final Account and Petition for Settlement and Distribution, filed herein by the Administratrix, and it being first proven to the Court that said account and petition were filed herein on the 14th day of March, 1921, and that by order of that date, said hearing was set for this date and Notice thereof was issued and that said Notice was published in the Ledger-Democrat, a newspaper at Broken Arrow, Oklahoma, for two successive weeks by publishing some in the issues of March 17th, 24th and 31st, 1921;

And said administratrix appearing in person and by Attorney and no objections to said account or petition having been filed herein, and no persons appearing to object thereto or to contest these me, and the court having heard the evidence offered in support of said account and Fetition and being fully advised in the premises, finds;

Administratrix was appointed by order of this Court and duly qualified and Letters of Administration were issued to her on the lath day of October, 1920, and thereafter proper she filed herein her Inventory and Appraisement of said Estate, and gave due,/legal notice to Creditors to present their claims and that the time for presenting and filing claims against said Estate had expired prior to the filing of said Final Account and Petition for Distribution; and that all claims against said Estate have been paid, and all costs and expenses of administration have been paid and discharged by the heirs and said estate is in condition to be settled and distributed.

The court further finds, that said W. H. Pugh, died on or about the 28th day of July, 1918, while a resident of Tulsa County, Oklahoma, and left him surviving as his sole and only heirs, Harriet C. Pugh, his widow and Mary M. Ellington, noe Pugh, his daughter, and no other children and no descendents of deceased children, and no other heits; and that both heirs are ever the age of 21 years and they are entitled to his estate in equal shares;

The Court further finds that the value of said estate does not exceed the sum of \$10,000.00 and there is no inheritance tax due the State of Oklahoma from
