

That the instrument bearing date of January 6, 1920 presented for probate as the last will and testament of said C. E. Cover, deceased was and is a holographic will, that the same is entirely in the handwriting of the testator himself, including the date and signature thereto, and was written dated and signed by said testator as his last will and testament:

That at the time of the execution of said will said C. E. Cover, deceased, was of full age, of sound mind and memory free from duress, menace, fraud and undue influence:

That Almira Cover, the surviving wife of said testator has heretofore filed in this court, pursuant to her rights under the statute her election not to take under the will but to take her portion or portions of the estate of her deceased husband under the provisions of the statute.

It is therefore ordered, adjudged and decreed that said instrument, subject to the statutory right of said widow to take under the provisions of the law, such portions ^{or part} of the estate the extent and amount of which to be hereafter determined, instead of under the provisions of said will be and the same is hereby allowed and probate granted as and for the last will and testament of said C. E. Cover deceased and that the same together with the proofs thereof including notice and proof of notice and said widow's election be recorded and that letters testamentary issue to Charles H. Cover and John A. Price, the persons named as executors upon their filing their oaths of office as required by law and each executing a bond to the State of Oklahoma in the penal sums of \$25000.00 each with sufficient sureties as is required by law to be approved by this Court.
