

Guardian's Deed

Know all men By These Presents:

That I, John M. Ingram, did on the 21st day of November, 1907, file my petition in the County Court of Tulsa County, State of Oklahoma to be appointed guardian of the persons and estates of Georgia L. Ingram, Roy B. Ingram, John M. Ingram, Jr., Anna L. Ingram and Maunetta Ingram, minors and that on said date the said County Court made an order for the hearing of said application on the 3rd day of December, 1907, and directing that personal notice of the said application be given to Mattie B. Ingram Aunt and Step-mother of said minors by citation at least ten days before the said 3rd day of December, 1907, to appear in said County Court and show cause if any she had why said appointment should not be made, the said Mattie B. Ingram being the only relative of said minors living in Tulsa County, and that said notice of citation was given to said Mattie B. Ingram as provided for in said order, notice was also given to all relatives and any persons interested in said matter by publication ten days before said hearing in the Tulsa Weekly Democrat, a newspaper printed and published in said Tulsa County, and that on the said 3rd day of December, 1908, the said County Court on the said hearing made an order appointing the said John M. Ingram guardian of said minors on his giving a bond in the sum of five hundred dollars (\$500.00), which bond was filed and approved by said Court on the 5th day of December, 1908, and letters of guardianship issued to said John M. Ingram, that on the 12th day of February, 1908, said Guardian filed his petition in said Court asking permission to sell the interests of said minors in certain real estate for the purpose of maintaining and educating said minors, a portion of said real estate being the remainder in fee on the life estate of John M. Ingram in the following described
