

in person and by his attorneys, Abbott, ^{my} Brown, and the Court after hearing the evidence and the testimony and the argument of counsel and being fully advised in the premises.

That the allegations in the petition contained are true, that the said Alice Partridge, deceased, was duly awarded as a full blood Creek Indian, of poster roll number, 6421 and there was selected for her in the year, 1899, and added to her heirs, as her distributive share of the lands of the Creek Native and Creek County, State of Oklahoma, Territory, the following described land situated in what is now Tulsa and Creek County, State of Oklahoma, Territory, -

The east half of the southeast quarter of section two (2)

township 18 north, range 10 west, Creek County

Oklahoma Territory, and the south half of the southeast

quarter of section five (5) township 11 north, (13)

North, range twelve (12) east, Tulsa County, Oklahoma

That the said Alice Partridge, deceased, died intestate on or about the 15 day of December, in the year 1899 in and while a resident of that part of what was formerly the Creek Nation of the Indian Territory, but which is now Tulsa County, State of Oklahoma, and that there have been no children born to her since the 4th day of March 1906, and that the said Anne Partridge, the petitioner is a half sister of the said Alice Partridge, deceased.

The Court further finds that the said Anne Partridge, the petitioner herein, did on or about the 13th day of January, 1909, make and execute and deliver to Charles Page, a deed of conveyance, thereby conveying to the said Charles Page all his right, title and interest in and to the land above described for a good and valuable consideration, the same approved, and in which consideration presented to the Court for approval, and in which consideration the Court finds is adequate.

Wherefore, it is by the Court considered, ordered and adjudged that the said deed of conveyance above described, be and the same is hereby approved according to the provisions of Section 9 of an act of Congress, approved May 27th, 1906, entitled, "An act for the removal of restrictions from part of the lands of the Nation of the Five

Civilized Tribes, and for other purposes." *Th. J. Chittam,*
