Be It Remembered, That on this day came before me the undersigned a Notary Public within and for the Western District of the Indian Territory aforesaid, duly commissioned and acting, Legue C. Perryman who first being duly sworn according to law, depose and state, That I am a citizen of the Creek Nation Ind. Ter, and that my Post Office address is Tulsa, Ind. Ter,

That I am 65 years old. That I am a member of the "Big Spring Town" of Creek Indians.

That I have represented the Creek Nation in the following various capacities, namely viz; as delegate to Washington D. C. as a member of the Creek Legislature in both Houses. As Judge of the Coverta District Court M. T. and the last eight years of Public life as Principal Chief of the said Creek Nation. That I am thoroughly acquainted with the Creek Tribe of Indians.

That I am personally well acquainted with one Sunday Grayson during his life time, that the said Sunday Grayson is now dead having been killed in the Seminole Nation on or about the month of May A.D. 1903. That he died intestate and without issue. That the said Sunday Grayson was a citizen by blood of the Creek Nation Ind. Ter. That to my certain knowledge the said Sunday Grayson (decd.) has left as his only surviving heirs at law the following named persons each of whom are of lawful age: Buck Grayson, Susie Grayson, Mattie Grayson and Jamie Grayson. That each of the above named heirs are personally known to me and I know that they are the exclusive and only direct heirs at law of the said Sunday Grayson (decd.) who was a full brother to the above named heirs. Further the affiant saith not.
