217431 C.J. COMPARED SHERIFF'S DEED

WHEREAS, On the 8 day of April, 1922, in the District Court in and for Tulsa County, State of Oklahoma, at the March term of said Court in a certain action therein pending, wherein David S. Whisley was plaintiff, and W. R. Amiot, George Bynum, W. O. Chapman, and the Saints of God Assembly of Skiatook Skiatook, Oklahoma, a corporation, were defendants, the said plaintiff, David S. Whisley, by the consideration of the Court recovered a judgment against the said defendants for foreclosure of a mortgage upon lots 16 and 17 in Block 23 in the town of Skiatook, Tulsa County, Oklahoma, according to the recorded plat thereof, to satisfy the sum of \$271.58, with interest thereon at the rate of 10 per cent per annum from the 4th day of August, 1921 until paid, also costs in said action expended, and an attorney's fee of \$50.00 as specified in said mortgage; and afterwards, on the 16 day of November, 1922, an execution and order of sale of that date was issued out of said Court by the court Clerk upon and in pursuance of said judgment, directed to the Sheriff of Said County of Tulsa, State of Oklahoma commanding him to cause the said lands and tenements of said defendants described in said judgment, to-wit:

Lots 16 and 17 in Block 23 in the town of Skiatook <sup>Tulsa County</sup> Oklahoma, according to the recorded plat thereof,

to be sold according to law, without appraisalment, said order of sale having been issued more than six months after the rendition of said judgment, and commanding said Sheriff to make a return of said order of sale with his certificate thereon, showing the manner in which said Sheriff had executed the same, within sixty (60) days of the date thereof; and,

WHEREAS, said order of sale was duly delivered to and received by said Sheriff on the 16 day of November, 1922, and said Sheriff by virtue thereof did, on the 17 day of November, 1922 advertise said property for sale by giving due and legal notice of the time and place of sale and the property to be sold by advertising the same in the Tulsa Daily Legal News, a newspaper of general circulation, printed and published in the County of Tulsa and state of Oklahoma, and in each issue thereof, being not less than once a week for at least thirty (30) days prior to the date of sale, which was the 19th day of December, 1922; and, WHEREAS, On the said 19th day of December, 1922, pursuant to said notice of sale, the said Sheriff did offer the said property for sale at public auction at the West front door of the Court House in the City of Tulsa in the said county of Tulsa, state of Oklahoma, at the hour of 2:00 o'clock P.M., at which sale the said property was sold and struck off to the said plaintiff, David S. Whisley, the party of the second part, for the sum of \$399.58, the said David S. Whisley being the highest bidder and that being the highest sum bid and the whole price paid for the same; and,

WHEREAS, The said Sheriff having made return of said order of sale into Court on the 20 day of December 1922, with his proceedings thereon duly certified and endorsed thereon,
