Know all men by these presents! That whereas, on the 17th day of April, 1922, in the District Court, Pulsa County, Oklahoma, in a certain action therein pending wherein R. d. Benjamin, administrator of the estate of James Corbin, deceased and Flossie Corbin, plaintiffs, and ". Woods and Amma Woods, defendents, the said plaintiffs, by the considerati n of the Court, recovered a judgement against the said defendents for foreclosure upon a mortgage upon all of lot three (3) Block nine (9) Fairview Addition to the city of Julsa, Oklahoma, according to the recorded plat thereof, lying and situate in the said County and State of Oklahoma to satisfy the sum of two hundred two 80/100 dollars, with interest thereon at the rate of ten per cent from the first day of February, 1922, until paid. Also costs in said action expended amounting to - - - dollars and attorney's fee of One Hundred dollars (\$100.00) as specified in said morgage. and asterwards, on the nonetcenth day of October, 1922, an execution and order of sale was issued out of said Court by the Clerk thereof upon and in pursuance of said judgement directed to the Sheriff of Tulsa County, Cklahoma, commanding him to cause the said lands and tenements of said defendents described in said judgement, all of lot three (3) Block nine (9) Fairview Addition to the City of Pulsa, Oklahoma, to be sold according to law, without ampraisement, said time of sale being more than six months after the rendition of judgement, as according to law, and commanding said Sheriff to make return of said order of sale with his certificate thereon showing the mamer in which said Sheriff had executed the same within sixty (60) days from the date thereof, and,

Whereas, said order of sale was duly delivered to and received by said sheriff the 19th day of Cotober, 1922, and said sheriff thereupon advertised said property for sale by giving due and legal notice of the time and place of sake and the property to be sold, by advertising the same in the Tulsa Daily Legal News, a newspaper of general circulation, printed and published in the County of Tulsa, once a week for at lease thirty (50) days prior to the date of sale, which was the 20th day of November, 1922, and by posting an advertisement of said sale at the Court House door and at five other public places in the County, two of which were in the township where said property is situated.

And, whereas, on the 20th day of Novembr, 1922, pursuant to said notice of sale, the Sheriff did offer the said property for sale at public auction at the front door of the Court Heuse of the City of Tulsa and County of Tulsa, at the heur of two o'clock P.K. at which sale the said property was sold and struck off to R. V. Benjamin, the party of the second part, for two hundred & fifty (250.) dolars, the said R. V.
