## ORDINANCE.

Ordinance No., 2296.

An ordinance vacating certain portions of West Fifth Street in the original town of Tulsa, Oklahoma, and declaring an emergency.

Be it ordained by the Board of Commissioners of the City of Tulsa, Oklahoma:

Section 1. That that portion of West Fifth Street in the original town of Tulsa, Oklahoma, described as follows, to-wit:

All that <sup>Part</sup> portion of said West Fifth Street bounded by a line beginning at the northeast corner of lot six (6) Block one hundred forty nine (149) in the original town of Tulsa, Oklahoma, running thence in a westerly direction on the north line of said lot 6, Block 149 a distance of 140 feet; thence in a northerly direction and parallel with the west line of said lot 6, block 149, a distance of six inches (6") thence in an easterly direction and parallel with the north line of said lot 6, a block 149, a distance of 140 feet; thence in a southerly direction and parallel with the east line of said lot 6, block 149, a distance of six inches (6") to the place of beginning, Be and the same is hereby vacated, and abandoned as a portion of a public street of the City of Tulsa, Oklahoma.

Section 2. That an emergency exists for the preservation of the public health and safety, by reason whereof this ordinance shall take effect from and after its passage, approval and publication.

Passed, and the emergency ruled upon separately and approved this 28th day of April 1922.
