

Whereas, a petition signed by all of the property owners owning property abutting on the strip of ground commonly known as a portion of Fourteenth Street TTT addition to the City of Tulsa, Oklahoma, has been presented to the Mayor and Board of Commissioners of the City of Tulsa, Oklahoma, asking that the strip of ground commonly known as a portion of Fourteenth Street therein described be vacated and abandoned as a public street or alley.

Now, therefore be it ordained by the Board of Commissioners of the City of Tulsa, Oklahoma:

Section 1, that a tract of land 6.5 feet wide as described as follows and commonly known as a portion of Fourteenth Street, beginning at the southwest corner of Lot 17, Block 4, TTT addition to the City of Tulsa, Oklahoma, thence south along the extension of the West line of said lot, a distance of 6.5 feet; thence east and parallel with the south line of said lot, a distance of 80 feet, thence north and parallel with the west line of said lot, a distance of 6.5 feet to a point on the south line of said lot; thence west along the south line of said lot a distance of 80 feet to the place of beginning. Be and the same is hereby vacated and abandoned as a public street or alley of said City.

Provided, however, that the city of Tulsa hereby reserves and shall retain forever the right to construct, reconstruct, repair, maintain and operate sanitary sewers and other appurtenances thereto, appertaining, now located in said strip of ground, commonly known as a portion of Fourteenth Street, or which of necessity should be constructed or maintained in said strip of ground, commonly known as a portion of Fourteenth Street, with the right of ingress and egress over said premises for the purposes above indicated and for said purposes four (4) feet on each side of the center line of said strip of ground, commonly known as a portion of Fourteenth Street, is hereby maintained by the City of Tulsa, upon which said City of Tulsa may allow public service corporations, companies, individuals or itself, to construct, maintain and operate facilities for public utilities, including poles, wires, pipes, conduits and other necessary accessories; and

Provided further that four (4) feet on each side of the center line of said strip of ground commonly known as a portion of Fourteenth Street, shall be construed to mean sufficient space near the center of said strip of ground commonly known as a portion of Fourteenth Street, for the purposes above specified.

And provided further that the above vacation is made subject to the conditions and provisions of paragraphs 11 of section 6 of article 11 of the Charter of the City of Tulsa,

Section 2. That an ordinance or parts of the ordinances in conflict with the provisions of this ordinance insofar as such conflict exists are hereby repealed.

Section 3. That an emergency exists for the preservation of the public welfare and safety by reason <sup>where</sup> of the ordinance shall take effect from and after its passage, approval and publication.

Passed and the emergency clause ruled upon separately and approved this 11th day of July, 1922.
