homa, by reason of said mortgage, and ordering a sale of the same to pay said judgement, interest, costs and attorney's fee and further providing that an order of sale issue from the Court Clerk's office of Tulsa County, Oklahoma, to the Sheriff of said County commanding him to appraise, advertise and sell said real estate according to law.

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And whereas, thereafter on the 24th day of October, 1922, in pursuance of said judgement an order of sale and special execution was issued by Frances Harvey, Court Clerk of TulsaCounty, directed to the Sheriff of Tulsa County, Oklahoma, commanding him to cause the said lands and tenements of said debtors above described to be appraised, advertised, and sold according to law and make return of said order of said Clerk's office within sixty (60) days thereafter.

That whereas, said order of sale and special execution was thereupon immediately placed in the hands of W. M. McCullough, the Sheriff of Tulsa County, Oklahoma, for execution and said sheriff upon the 27th day of October, 1922, went upon said real estate above described and duly seized the same and selected R. Worsham was the highest and best bidder at said sale and paid the sum of twelve hundred fifty dollars (\$1250), for said property and the same was sold to him for said amount.

And whereas, said order of sale was therafter on December 1st, 1922, returned by the Sheriff of Tulsa County to the office of the Court Clerk of said County with a statement showing his action under said order.

And whereas, there was a motion thereupon on December 6th, 1922, filed by the plaintiff in said action asking that saidsale is confirmed.

And, whereas, said motion to confirm said sale came on to be heard before the District Court of Tulsa Courty on January 11th, 1923, and was sustained and said sale was in all things confirmed by the Court and the Sheriff of Tulsa County was ordered and directed to make a deed to the said purchaser of said sale, Charles M.Worsham, conveying all the right, title and interest that the said defendents, S.J. Doyle and Dell Doyle had in and to said property
