Pursuant to call by personal notice by the Chairman of the Christian Missionary Board of Tulsa, Oklahoma, said meeting to be held on October, 14th, 1922, at 4:00 o'clock P.M., at 634 Mayo Building, Tulsa, Oklahoma. E. E. Dix, then presented an offer by T. A.
