

434 indebtedness secured by this mortgage shall be collected by an attorney or through proceedings in any County, State or Federal Court, an additional sum of ten per cent of the amount due shall be recovered as attorney's fees and shall be included in any judgment or decree of foreclosure as a part of the indebtedness secured by this mortgage.

SIXTH. Parties of the first part, for said consideration, do hereby expressly waive appraisement of said real estate and all benefits of the homestead, exemption and stay laws in Oklahoma.

ORDINANCE NO. 2055.

An Ordinance vacating a part of Fourteenth street from the east line of Houston Avenue to the west line of Norvell Road in the City of Tulsa, Oklahoma; with certain reservations; and declaring an emergency.

WHEREAS, A petition in writing, signed by the owners of the real estate adjoining that portion of Fourteenth Street hereinafter described, has been presented to the Mayor and Board of Commissioners of the City of Tulsa, Oklahoma, asking that said portion of said Fourteenth Street be vacated and abandoned as a public street; and

WHEREAS, it appears upon examination by said Board that said portion of said Fourteenth Street is not necessary for the uses of the public as a public Street.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF TULSA, OKLAHOMA,

SECTION 1, That that portion of Fourteenth Street in the City of Tulsa, Oklahoma, described as follows, to-wit:

Fourteenth Street from the east line of Houston Avenue to the west line of Norvell road, be, and the same is hereby vacated and abandoned forever as a public street.

Provided, however, that the City of Tulsa hereby reserves and shall retain forever the right to construct, reconstruct, repair, maintain and operate sanitary sewers, and other appurtenances thereto appertaining now located in said street, or which of necessity should be constructed or maintained in said street, with the right of ingress and egress over said premises for the purposes above indicated, and upon which portions of said street so vacated, the City of Tulsa may allow public service corporations, companies, individuals or itself to construct, maintain and operate facilities for public utilities, including poles, wires, pipes conduits and other necessary accessories; and.
