An Ordinance vacating FRANKFORT AVENUE from the North line of East Easton Street in Northside Addition to the CITY OF TULSA, OKLAHOMA, to the North line of HASKELL STREET, with certain reservation and declaring an emergency.

WHEREAS, a written petition has been filed with the Mayor and Board of Commissioners of the City of Tulsa signed by the Board of Education of said City, who is the owner of the property affected by the above vacation hereinafter made, which petitioner asks that the Mayor and Board of Commissioners take the necessary steps to vacate the portions of the streets above described, and,

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Board of Commissioners have investigated that advisability of making the vacation asked for in said petition, and find that it is to the best interest of the public and the property affected that said vacation be made.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF TULSA, ONLAH MA: SECTION 1, That FRANKFORT AVENUE from the North line of EAST MASTON STREET in NORTH-SIDE ADDITION to the CITY OF TULSA, OKIAHOMA to the North line of Haskell Street, be and the same is hereby vacated and abandoned forever as a public street or avenue, Frovided however, the City of Tulsa, hereby reserves and retains forever, the right to repair, maintain and operate sanitary sewers or other appurtenances thereto that might be located in said street with the right of ingress and egress over said premises for the purpose above indicated.

Provided, further, that the above vacation is made subject to the conditions and provisions of Paragraph Eleven (11) Section 3ix (6) Article Two (2) of the Charter of the City of Tulsa.

SECTION 2. Provided further that the above vacation is made subject to the condition that the Board of Education of the City of Tulsa, Tulsa County, Oklahoma, deed to the city of Tulsa for public highway purposes (the North fifteen (15') feet of Lot 6, in Plock 3, Mountain View Addition to the City of Tulsa, Tulsa County, Oklahoma, according to the recorded plat thereof, and that the said strip of ground so described be cleared of all obstructions and right of way and be prepared for street purposes without any expense to the City of Tulsa, and at the expense of the Board of Education of the city of Tulsa.

SECTION 3. That all ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict with the provisions of this ordinance insofar as such conflict exists, are hereby repealed.

SECTION 4. That an emergency exists for the preservation of the public welfare and safety by reason whereof, this ordiance shall take effect from and after its passage, approval and publication.

PASSED, and the emergency clause ruled upon separately, and approved this 17th day of April. 1923.
