It appearing by motion of defendant, Osage Manufacturing Company that all of the matters in controversy under its cross petition between the complainant and defendant, Sand Springs Interurban Railway Company, now styled Sand Springs Railway Company, have been adjusted and agreed upon and that in said motion defendant Osage Manufacturing Company recognizes the right of defendant Sand Springs Interurban Railway Company, now styled Sand Springs Railway Company, to a right-of-way across the West side of Lots one to seven inclusive of Block Sixty-six of the City of Tulsa, State of Oklahoma, which said right-of-way is more particularly set out and defined in the condemnation proceedings had in the District Court of Tulsa County, Oklahoma, in Cause No. 2776, and that Defendant Osage Manufacturing Company moves the Court to dismiss its cross petition against said Sand Springs Interurban Railway Company, now styled Sand Springs Railway Company and complainant.

It is therefore ordered, considered and adjudged that said motion be and the same is hereby sustained and said cross petition dismissed as to said complainant, and as to said defendant, Sand Springs Interurban Railway Company, now styled Sand Springs Railway Company.
